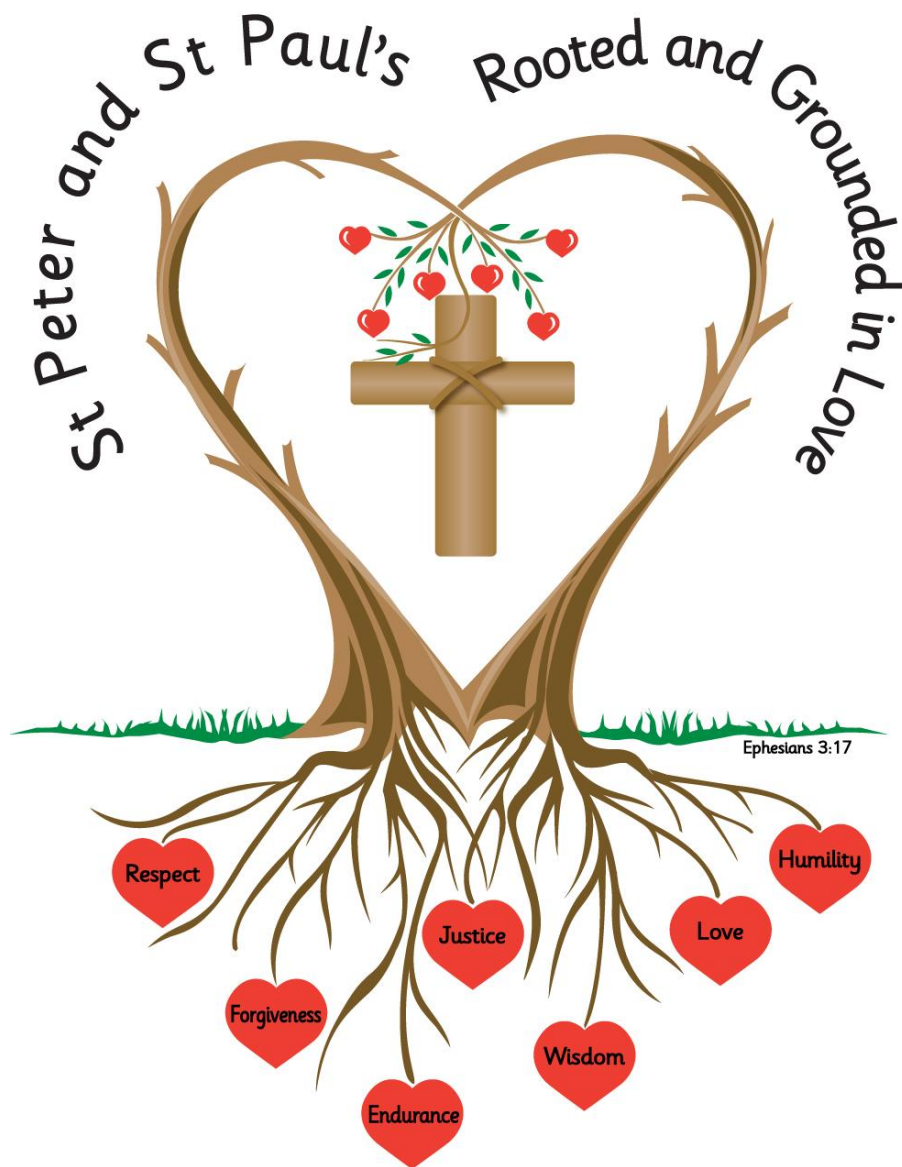




Welcome to Year 4

Useful Information

Be on time



Breakfast Club is available from 7.30am –Please ensure children are booked in using School Money app so that staff know who to expect the following day. Younger children need to be handed over to staff at the door to ensure safe arrival as registers are not completed in class until 8.50am

Children need to arrive **between** 8.45am – 8:50am and are not allowed on the playground unsupervised before 8.45am when the doors are opened. Please supervise children whilst waiting for doors to open, particularly if they are on the trim trail.

School finishes at 3.20pm. **Please inform family members to park away from Arundel Street as it is dangerous when cars drive down this street at the start/end of the day. For safety, the school car park is only for staff use.**

Years 3/4 door leads out to playground and y5/6 directly to classrooms.

Please make sure that someone is here to collect your child on time at 3.20pm as children can become unsettled if they are left waiting.

Please see link for remember expectations relating to school uniform, jewellery and hairstyles. All clothing needs to be labelled clearly (writing with a permanent pen on labels is fine) to make it easier to return any lost items.

School Bags

Please **do not** bring any bags other than the red school reading book bag and small lunch bag if needed as space in KS2 is limited. Children are only allowed small backpacks in years 5/6.

Waterproof Pants and Wellingtons

We encourage all children to have a pair of waterproof pants and wellingtons (with a small bag to put them in) to keep in school. The children will often take part in outdoor learning activities and wet playtimes.

Earrings

It is better if children do not wear earrings for school but if they choose to please make sure they are plain small studs. These need to be removed (at home) for PE (Thursday in the autumn term) as they cannot be covered over with tape. **If having ears pierced, please do this at the start of summer holidays so that PE lessons are not missed.**

Water Bottles

Please send in a water bottle with a sports top rather than a lid that unscrews. As we are a Healthy School, children are only allowed to drink plain water during lesson time (juice or flavoured water are only allowed in lunch boxes). Water bottles will be sent home each day so that they can be washed out and refilled.

The cost of school dinners is currently £2.90 per day which should be paid on School Money at the time of booking so that meal choices can also be made.

Snack

Children are only allowed to bring a piece of fruit for morning snack.

Reading Books

Please ensure these are in bags on the days we change which are Mondays and Thursdays. It is very important that children practise their reading skills at home by reading to an adult on a regular basis. This should include asking children about what they have read to develop their comprehension skills. Ideally, this needs to be for a few minutes each day. Please sign reading records to show that your child has read and when the book has been finished and is ready for changing.

Homework

In KS2, homework booklets are given out at the start of each half term and children have this time to complete tasks before returning at the end of the half term.

Mobile Phones

Children are not allowed phones in school unless parents have filled in a form requesting that they need one because they walk home on their own.

Our PE days are Thursdays for first term (swimming)

Pupils will need a full PE kit in school at all times – black shorts (not cycling shorts), white t-shirt and pumps. Children will bring home kits at the end of each half term to be washed. It is important that these are returned to school or children will be unable to take part in the lesson.

Class Trip

We will be planning to take the children out of school later in the year and will provide information on this. We will set up payment on the online system in advance in case you want to pay instalments.

Swimming Lessons

All children in KS2 go swimming throughout the year and information will be provided for you in advance. Children need to have a swimming costume, fitted trunks and a swimming hat if you want to get these in advance. Children need to be in school by 8.50am on swimming days.

Superstar Celebration

This will take place every Friday morning (from 12th Sept) and parents are welcome to attend. A Superstar certificate is awarded to one child from each class and children can bring in certificates and awards from meaningful activities completed out of school hours. Each month a 'megastar' certificate is awarded in each class to someone who consistently goes above and beyond.

Breakfast Club and After School Club

Our wrap around care is from 7.30am until 5.45pm and children need to be booked in using School Money to be allocated a place. The after-school club needs to close promptly at 5.45pm and children must be collected by this time to avoid having to pay a late collection charge.

All bookings need to be made in advance using the online payment system and unfortunately, due to numbers having increased significantly, there is a chance your child may not have a place if they are not booked in as we have to ensure we have the appropriate staffing in place. **Places cannot be reserved on the day and you will need to ring school to check if space.**

Behaviour and Positive Recognition

In school, we encourage everybody to behave in 'The St Peter and St Paul's Way', with our school code of conduct being firmly based on our core Christian values.



Wherever possible, children are praised for behaving well and where possible this is often by positive verbal recognition. A project we were involved with involving other schools/surveys with our parents highlighted that there is very little value to a child when they are rewarded for doing things which are the 'norm' or 'generally expected' and that instant verbal praise is the most effective reward for children as it has far more meaning to them at the time.

We have a behaviour ladder (as above) and children's names all start on green 'ready to learn' at the start of each day. Children may be asked to move their name up/down the ladder. If children *repeatedly* behave in a negative manner after several reminders and have moved their name, they may be asked to spend time in 'Reflection' during their break time. If this happens on several occasions, parents will be notified and children may end up missing out on some of the additional fun aspects of school.

We also use a system linked to **learning powers** where we choose a specific 'success criteria' to work on each week. These are based on: making connections and having curiosity, changing and learning, building resilience, having strategic awareness, creativity and learning relationships. The intention is that each child will add their name to the wall of recognition by the end of the week for achieving one of the learning powers and that collectively as a class they can all achieve this. We have seen the pleasure the class get from this accomplishment and that they all try to encourage each other and recognise when individuals have demonstrated the learning power.

There are 8 learning powers:

- **Don't give up** Donald Duck
- **Concentrate** Colin Caterpillar
- **Co-operate** Tim & Tina Tortoise
- **Have a go** Harold Hedgehog
- **Curious** Cathy Camel
- **Keep improving** Ivy Insect
- **Imagination** Isabel Iguana
- **Enjoy Learning** Edward Elephant

Year 4 Times Table Check

The multiplication times table check (MTC) is a statutory assessment for all Year 4 children in England which takes place in June. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12x. More information about the check can be found on:
