St Christopher's High School – If you are wanting to apply for St Christopher's, parental attendance at church is a requirement to place you higher on the admissions list and we would recommend that you read the Admissions Policy on their website if considering this school. Attendance is over a two-year period **before** application in year 5. Occasionally, children have got in without church attendance however, this is only likely if the year group has lower numbers of applications. We are receiving some lovely feedback about the new family Lighthouse Service which takes place at 3pm each Sunday if you wanted to check this out!

School Start Time – Just a reminder that our official start time and the final time when children need to be in school by is **8.50am registration**. We open doors from 8.45am to enable families to have a staggered arrival and to avoid everyone arriving at the same time as this helps with traffic and parking near school. Please ensure children are not on the yard without parental supervision before 8.45am and that anyone attending Breakfast Club is signed in.

Arundel Street Thank you for taking the time to park away from Arundel St and walking up to school at the start and end of the day as we try to keep our families safe.

Uniform – Thank you for ensuring children have all items of uniform/black school shoes (not trainers with sports logos) ready for the start of the new year. If children are having any unusual holiday hairstyles, please make sure they return with styles that are appropriate for school. Reminder that if children wear earrings these need to be small silver/gold studs. If having ears pierced, please get these done at the start of the holidays to avoid PE lessons being missed.

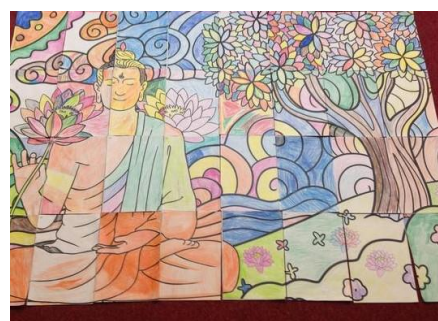
